Notes

[1] A usual resident of the UK is anyone who, on census day, was in the UK and had stayed or intended to stay in the UK for a period of 12 months or

more, or had a permanent UK address and was outside the UK and intended to be outside the UK for less than 12 months.

- [2] A communal establishment is an establishment providing managed residential accommodation. 'Managed' in this context means full-time or part-time supervision of the accommodation.
- [3] Schoolchildren and students in full-time education studying away from their family home are treated as usually resident at their term-time address. Students are shown as a percentage of the total population living in the area.
- [4] A household is defined as one person living alone, or a group of people (not necessarily related) living at the same address who share cooking facilities and share a living room or sitting room or dining area.
- [5] This is the number of bedrooms in a household's accommodation. A bedroom is defined as any room that was intended to be used as a bedroom when the property was built, or any room that has been permanently converted for use as a bedroom. It also includes all rooms intended for use as a bedroom even if not being used as a bedroom at the time of the Census. Bedsits and studio flats are counted as having one bedroom.
- [6] Occupancy rating provides a measure of whether a household's accommodation is overcrowded or under occupied. The ages of the household members and their relationships to each other are used to derive the number of bedrooms they require. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household has one fewer bedroom than required, whereas +1 implies that they have one more bedroom than required.
- [7] A dependent child is a person aged 0 – 15 in a household or aged 16 –18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s).
